THE DESIGNATIONS

A=ABUNDANT....certain to be present in large numbers in suitable habitats.

C=COMMON....likely to be present in good numbers in suitable habitats.

U=UNCOMMON....possible to be present in small numbers in suitable habitats.

R=RARE....unlikely (but not impossible) to be found, even in suitable habitat.

H=HISTORICAL....not recorded after 1995.

X=ACCIDENTAL....only one or two recorded observations.
i=IRRUPTIVE....large migrations into the area in some winters, totally absent in other winters.

pn=POSSIBLE NESTER....within nesting range and correct habitat, but nesting behavior not observed.

ln=LIKELY NESTER....some signs of nesting behavior observed, but nesting not confirmed.

kn=KNOWN NESTER....occupied nest, flightless young, feeding behavior, etc. confirms nesting.
